It is truly wonderful to greet our veteran members and to meet our new members. At our November and December meetings, members shared freely, discussing the early challenges as well as the ongoing issues that laryngectomees have to face.

In November we were delighted to welcome our guest speaker, Lindsey Lambert. Ms. Lambert is a speech pathologist, formally of MEEI and now is Clinical Specialist, Northeast Regional Sales Manager at Atos Medical, Inc. Lindsey shared information on some of the latest in medical supplies available to the laryngectomee as well as her professional expertise from the perspective of an accomplished speech pathologist. As a clinical educator and sales representative, Lindsey focuses on voice and pulmonary rehabilitation for the laryngectomee. Whether one relies on an electrolarynx or a TEP(tracheal esophageal puncture) with voice prosthesis for communication it is very important to address one's quality of breathing which is dependent on air filtration, heating and moisture levels. That being said, Lindsey underscored the need for laryngectomees to wear an HME or humidity moisture exchange in an attempt to moderate the drastic change in air moisture and temperature experienced by a laryngectomee thus alleviating problems with mucus control. Lindsey also demonstrated one of ATOS' new products: the "Stabili-base" baseplate which is designed for those who have a deeply recessed stoma or those who are struggling to maintain a seal, especially while using "hands-free" speech. Ms. Lambert's presentation was both interesting and informative.

With the start of our new year, we remind members that yearly dues, which is \$15.00 for laryngectomees and \$5.00 for family members, is due.
